





# **Getting to the city & public transport**

If you arrive in Budapest by airplane at Liszt Ferenc International Airport, you can reach the city center either by **public transport** or by **taxi**.



There are two main public transport options by bus:

- Bus 100E Direct service to the city center. (Special ticket required: 2,200 HUF, you can use your bankcard on this bus to buy the ticket)
- Bus 200E To Kőbánya-Kispest station, then transfer to Metro line M3 (blue line) to Deák Ferenc tér.

Tickets can be purchased at BKK Customer Service Centres or from BKK Ticket Machines outside the airport.

#### **Public Transport Costs**

**Student HUNGARY PASS:** 1,890 HUF – You **MUST** have a valid Student ID.

Before you get your student ID, the most economical ticket is a **full price monthly pass:** 

**Budapest Monthly Pass:** 8,950 (valid only in Budapest)

Pest County Monthly Pass: 9,450 HUF (valid for all forms of

transport within Pest County)

## **Pro-tip from our students**

To avoid queues, download the **BudapestGO Application to your phone and register an account** to buy your ticket or pass online. (Note, you may need to change your store location on your phone.)

If you have a lot of luggage, the best and easiest way to get from the airport to the center of Budapest is by taxi. Uber and Bolt taxis can be booked in advance on their respective mobile phone applications. The cost is approximately 13 000 - 18 000 HUF.

## **MOVING TO HUNGARY**

- **Prepare for a four-season climate.** Bring both light and warm clothing, as Hungary has hot summers and cold winters. Check the weather forecast for Budapest <a href="here">here</a>.
- Bring any necessary medication. If you're on prescription medications, it's best to bring enough for your stay.
- Bring all your official documents. Always keep both the originals and a few copies (paper or digital) with you.
- Plan your budget. Bring enough money to cover your initial two months of settling in expenses. Expect to spend more at the beginning. On average, 600–750 EUR per month should cover food, accommodation, and basic costs, but this can vary depending on lifestyle and housing. Cost of living calculator: www.numbeo.com

#### Insurance

Health Insurance in Hungary is mandatory if you want to receive medical care.

**EU/EEA member states** (EEA = EU member states and Norway, Switzerland, Iceland, and Lichtenstein): it is advised for students to obtain a European Health Insurance Card from your health insurance provider in your home country before you leave home.

**Non-EU/EEA member states** (country that is not part of the European Economic Area): Purchase your own insurance before leaving home.

**Scholarship holders:** Students with scholarship offered by the Minister of Education in Hungary are eligible for health care services in Hungary and will receive a "TAJ card", which enables them to use health services in Hungary.

Please note that medical care is costly without insurance. Do check with your provider what is covered by your insurance policy.

#### **MEDICAL CARE**

In case of dangerous, life-threatening symptoms, go to the Emergency Room of the closest **hospital**, (**kórház** in Hungarian) and look for the sign **Sürgősségi**. In emergency situations having a valid TAJ card, or private insurance is not a must, you will be examined without valid health insurance. However, after receiving medical care, you will most likely have to pay for the examination and treatment.



# What type of insurance is the UNIMED health insurance?

It is a health insurance product designed to finance medical care used by students studying in Hungary.

When an insured has an illness or an accident, the insurer organises and covers the costs of medical attention up to HUF 2,000,000 p.a. incurred at a health service provider that has contract with the insurer. The insured therefore is provided the medical service and receives no money from the insurer.

#### **Pharmacies**

If you're experiencing mild symptoms—such as a slight fever, runny nose, cold, flu, indigestion, cough, or minor aches, you can go to any pharmacy to buy over-the-counter medicine. In Budapest, there are several 24-hour pharmacies available. Just google "gyógyszertárak" to get the list.

# **Money matters**

The official currency in Hungary is the Hungarian forint (HUF). Check <u>OANDA</u> for the latest exchange rates. Credit and debit cards, such as **Visa** and **Mastercard** are widely accepted in nearly every major hotel, restaurant, and shop. It's best to use Forint for your everyday purchases. You can easily find exchange offices around the city.

It's a good idea to have a Hungarian bank account to manage your finances while studying in our country.

We recommend you choosing UniCredit (ask for assistance upon arrival), which has a partnership with the university, but other options (OTP, CIB, Erste, Raiffeisen etc.) are available as well.

#### Pro-tip from our students

Revolut and Wise are also widely used in Hungary.

The Hungarian academic credit system is an ECTS-compatible system. The calculation of the credits is based on the number of working hours of the student (one credit is 30 student working hours on average). Grades are as follows: 1 - fail, 2 - sufficient or pass, 3 - medium or satisfactory, 4 - good, 5 - excellent

#### **Enrollment and Registration**

Complete your enrollment and register your classes in each semester before the deadline (7 September 2025).

You can manage study matters online, through the <u>NEPTUN</u> system (e.g. registering for the semester, enrolling in courses and exams); your can trace your performance (electronic grade book), finances (e.g. scholarships, student credit) and can manage many other matters in a few clicks, instead of standing in long lines such as applying for a student card.

#### Administrative Tip

Wherever you must indicate your name, write it exactly as it appears in the machine-readable section of your passport — this is the part with two lines of letters, numbers, and the '<' symbol at the bottom of the photo page.

#### **NEK Identifier**

The first step of getting a permanent student card is to have a NEK identifier.

The NEK identifier is a unique 16-digit number which contains your personal information and is issued by any local government office (Kormányhivatal).

Go to **the nearest "Kormányablak"** (Government Administration Office).

The nearest one to the University is only a 10 minute walk.

Documents Needed for NEK application:

- Passport size photo
- Passport with Study Visa or Residence Permit
- Your address card or proof or address

Fill in the NEK (Nemzeti Egységes Kártyarendszer) form data sheet. Data must match your information in NEPTUN.

Your signature

Sign the NEK sheet only AFTER you have double-checked your personal data. The data on the NEK sheet must be the same as the data in your passport (if not, your student card request will be rejected!

#### **Applying for a Student Card**

Log into Neptun, then click "Administration/ Student Card Request" then click on the black button 'Add New'. A window pops up; this is where you need to enter your NEK identifier number without dashes (e.g.: 000000-XXX000-1111 -> 000000XXX0001111). For type of demand choose first application, then click on the save button. After this, you are eligible for a temporary student card.



**Temporary Student Card** (for exchange student and full-time students)

The Academic Registrar's Office will issue you a Temporary Student ID until your permanent student card is ready. The document is valid for 60 days, so pay attention to the expiration date. When you receive your permanent student card, please make sure it is validated by a sticker on the backside. The sticker is available from the Regisrar's Office.

The permanent card is NOT valid without a sticker, and it must be validated each semester. Without a temporary or a permanent student card you are not eligible for a student discount for the public transportation passes, or entries to museums and such.

**BudapestGO**: We recommend using the BudapestGO app because it provides real-time departure times and useful features, such as mobile ticket purchasing and locations of public water fountains (tap water is safe to drink in Hungary!).

The green MOL Bubi bikes are one of the favourite transportation methods among the residents of Budapest. You can discover the city easily, while doing physical activity! Not to mention the ecofriendly side of using a bike! The good news is that you can rent a bike and discover the beautiful Budapest for only 1500 HUF/month. The first 30 minutes of each ride started is free. For continuous rides over 30 minutes, a fee of 50 HUF will be charged for each minute started.

How does it work?

- Download the app and register
- 2. Find a pickup location (MOL Bubi station)
- 3. Pick it up
- 4. Discover the city
- Return it to the MOL Bubi station
